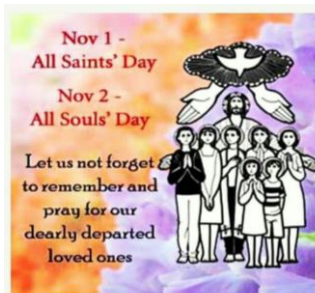

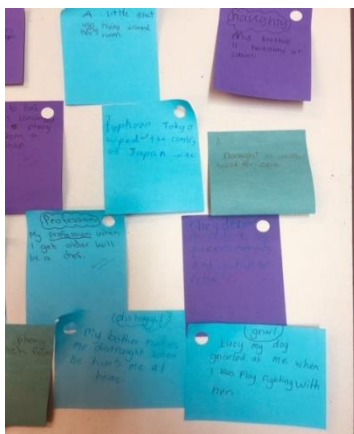
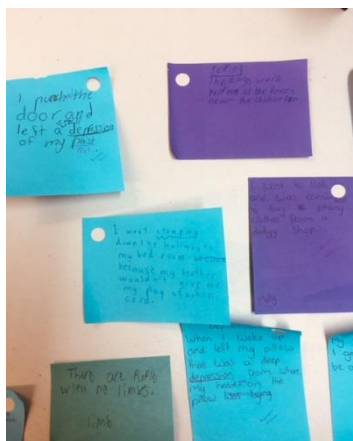
Literacy Support

It is hard to believe that Term 4 is already here! Over the past year we have worked with many students from Year 1 to Year 6, who have been supported in one way or another with their literacy skills. We are now lucky enough to be able to offer this to the Pre-Primary class. Early intervention is the key to helping our students become successful and confident readers and spellers.



In the upper grades, we have been learning new words and using these in our writing. The more we read, the more we learn and extend our vocabulary. We have been learning new words each week to help extend our vocab. These are some of the words we have been looking at:

Gnarl, distraught, profession, haughty, wring, typhoon, stomping and phony.



We use different ways to help us remember what each word means. Our vocab trees help us to remember the meaning of words we have learnt. How do you try and remember the meaning of a new and different word?

The children are keen to collect as many lids as possible so a container has been placed in the undercover area and all the children have to do is pop the lids in this container sometime during the school day.

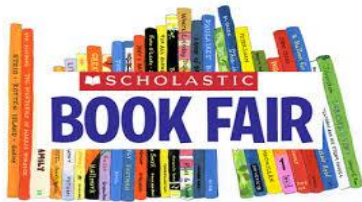

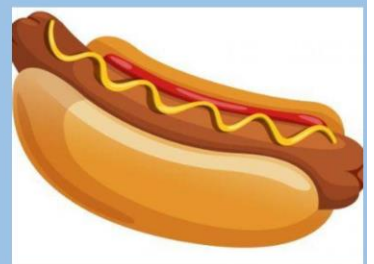
