





We have been busy listening to the initial sounds in words and learning all about the sounds /m/ and /s/. We are getting very good at blending onset and rime in words. That is when a word is broken into two sounds and we blend the two sounds together to make the word.

We are learning to count a collection of up to 20, ensuring we only count each object only once. We are learning to subitise collections of 4,5 and 6 on ten frames and discuss our thinking. Such as; "I saw 1 dot on the top row and 3 dots on the bottom row, 1 and 3 make 4". We have been learning all about measuring and the words we use when measuring such as tall, long and short.
