KINDY 2021

If you or other family members or friends have a child ready for Kindy next year and would like them to attend St Joseph's, please call the School Office or drop in and place their name in our Kindy 2021 list. Interviews for Kindy 2021 have begun so it is important to put your child's name down early. Children born between July 1st, 2016 and June 30th, 2017 are eligible to attend Kindy in 2021.

PARISH SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM

As Archbishop Timothy Costelloe has allowed the reception of some sacraments to resume, the Parish of St John the Baptist will be offering the Sacrament of **First Communion** to baptised Catholic students in Year 4 or higher on **August 23**rd, **2020**.

The Sacrament of First Confession will be offered to baptised Catholics in Year 3 and any other older Catholic students who have yet to receive this sacrament on November 11, 2020.

At this stage, Parishes do not have permission to confer the Sacrament of Confirmation. Should this change in the near future, parents of Catholic students in Year 6 will be notified.

SCHOOL FEES

By this time of the year, everyone should have almost paid half or more than half of their fees whether paying by installment or paying by lump sum. If you are experiencing problems meeting your school fees payments, please make an appointment with Natasha Butcher to work out a payment plan. All fees are payable in full by the end of Term 3 and may be paid in installments. Paying a little each fortnight or month reduces the lump sum to be paid by the end of Term 3.

If you have a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card (PPS) you are entitled to a discount off your fees. To claim the discount, you need to bring your current card to the Office to be copied and fill in a claim form.

During Terms 3 the Canteen will be selling mugs of warm mile before school for 50c. Mile will only be available between 8.15am and 8.30am.

WINTER UNIFORM REMINDER



As the weather has gotten chilly please ensure your children come to school in their winter uniforms. Long sleeve tops worn under the school t-shirt and leggings, or tights, worn under skorts or shorts, <u>ARE NOT</u> part of the school uniform. If your child's legs are cold, they should be wearing track pants to school. Likewise, non-uniform jumpers and jackets are not to be worn. The school

uniform shop sells fleece jumpers and windproof jackets. Orders can be completed and paid for on-line. If you cannot afford to purchase winter uniforms, please contact the office for assistance.

Please ensure your child's winter uniform is labelled as the children take off jumpers and track pants and forget to put them into their bags. Labels help us to return items to their owner.

PARENTS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS



As per the Government's Phase 3 regulations, parents are now permitted to enter school grounds but not enter classrooms.

Students can still be dropped off at the front gate of the school. Kindy and Pre-primary children who are dropped at the gate will continue to be walked to their area by a teacher or senior student.

Parents entering school grounds at the end of the day to pick up children from the classroom are

reminded to observe the Government's 2m² social distancing expectations.

School-wide consistent approach for behaviour support

Low Level Concern:

Failing to.....

get on with work, wait for turn or sharing fairly, follow teacher instructions, keep hands to oneself, follow classroom rules, follow school rules, allow others to learn, respect the rights of others.

Actions

Teacher verbally reminds student of appropriate behaviour in accordance with classroom charter or school rules. Move student away from situation.


Please note:

- Step 3 and higher may result in exclusion from school events.
- An Individual Behaviour Support Plan (IBSP) overrides the flowchart.
- When pastoral notes are recorded in SEQTA, the Principal and Assistant Principal are included in the notifications as well as any other relevant staff.

St Joseph's forbids the use of any form of child abuse, corporal punishment or other degrading punishment such as humiliation, belittling, denigration, scapegoating, threatening or ridicule.
